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President's Column

SALON JUDGES

There are nine meetings a year when members' photos are judged in competition. We are lucky to have several very experienced photographers who have been trained in judging and are willing to tackle this for us. We pay them very little – just \$25. It takes them hours to evaluate the 100 - 130 images and another 2 hours plus to talk directly to us about their judgment at our salon meeting. Challenging!

No matter what the rules for good photography may be. No matter the guidelines we give to judges. No matter what training they have received. Ultimately, the judges will always be influenced by their own biases, skills and preferences. We can learn from the judges' comments. But we should never expect full agreement, especially on our own photos. Judging is a very tough task and our club has many fine photographers. This makes it especially difficult. I am thankful the judges are willing to help us.

I listen to comments and compare them to my own reaction to each photo. Sometimes I agree (especially if they like my own images). I also like to think about what they did not like about my photos or those of others, and what I could do differently. Next time I may just try it their way. I am always pleased to see the incredible photos produced by all the members of our club – that is how I learn the most. Those examples are the best stimulus for me as I try to do better with my next photos.

I would like to suggest, if you haven't already, that you take a moment to thank our judges for their effort – either during the snack break or after the meeting. You might also thank Terry Butler for her work in locating judges for the salons.

If you have negative reaction to what a judge says, please direct it to Terry or to me, not to the judge. If we hear those reactions to a particular judge it may influence us to not invite that judge back. However, a negative comment to a judge may be just the thing that turns them away if we ask for their help again.

Photography is art. It is a cliché, but beauty is in the eye of

the beholder. The judge is a beholder and so are all of you. Make the best of it and enjoy the salons.

It is a luxury of membership in this club to have so many members step into active roles to make the club as enjoyable as it is. One area of that activity is the programs. After Roberta Mullin did such a tremendous job of this we worried about who would take over and what kind of job would they do? I should have known not to worry. St. Paul Portfolio

It's time to finish your St. Paul portfolio

It's almost time to wrap-up this year's portfolio challenge.

The basics

- All dues paying members are encouraged to participate, including new members.
- Photos can be taken at any time during 2017. (So you still have time to participate!)
- All photos must be taken within the boundaries of the city of St. Paul. (See map at https://saintpaulbybike.wordpress.com/o-h-map-frontupdate-4-29-10-indd/)
- All processing techniques are allowed.
- All images must be submitted digitally.
- 12 images are required to compete for a portfolio award.
 - A portfolio can include images from as many or as few categories as you like, but more diverse portfolios are likely to score better.
 - o All images submitted as a portfolio are also eligible for individual awards.
- The maximum number of images submitted by any one photographer is 12.

Awards

Portfolio awards (based on 12 images):

 Most diverse portfolio: For the portfolio(s) that best demonstrates the photographer's ability to produce

- compelling images over a broad range of subjects using a variety of techniques.
- Best portrayal of St. Paul's diversity: For the portfolio(s) that best captures the diversity of St Paul's people and culture.

Individual awards

- Best image portraying an aspect of St. Paul. These categories are intended to be broad and many images will fit in more than one. Each photographer determines the category they are competing in.
 - o B St. Paul's built environment (architecture, infrastructure, and cityscapes)
 - o N St. Paul's natural environment (nature, parks, landscapes, people interacting with nature)
 - o P St. Paul's people (life in St. Paul, including street photography and sports)
 - o A St. Paul's arts and culture (art and art events of all kinds, including performing arts)
 - O Anything else
- Best image of St. Paul's ethnic diversity (qualifying images determined by judge)
- Most creative image (qualifying images determined by judge)

Submit your images

Images can be submitted between December 20, 2017 and January 2, 2018.

• All images must be submitted by 6:30 pm on January 2.

Digital image requirements

- Images must be jpgs with a maximum size of 1920 pixels wide and/or tall and less than 1mb
- All participants are limited to 12 images.
 - o If you submit 12 images, I will assume you are submitting a portfolio.
 - o If you submit fewer than 12 images, I will assume they are individual category entries.
- Label each image in your entry with the category, title, and club member number.

Filter for Feeling - John Gregor

John Gregor, who has owned and operated ColdSnap Photography for 20 years, has a BA from the University of Minnesota in "Documentary Expression Of American Culture Through Photography" and a Masters of Education with an emphasis in "Photographic Literacy" from St. Scholastica College. Gregor has been teaching photographic courses and workshops for over 30 years. He is an accomplished photographer and educator with several books and numerous magazine articles to his name.

On November 21, John Gregor will come to our SPCC meeting and present a program, "Filter for Feeling."

Concerning the use of filters, Gregor stated;

"From smooth and serene to wild and wooly, texture in a photograph can convey feeling and emotion that reflects the photographer's response to the subject and surroundings. Using filters are the key to creating texture in landscape photography. It is more than simply screwing a filter in front of your lens, it is about understanding the relationship between exposure time and subject movement."

Why did you choose to join the Saint Paul Camera Club?

What brand/model of camera(s) do you shoot with?

I have a variety of cameras both digital and film. They range from mirrorless to full-frame (Canons), and 35mm (Canon) to 6cm square format (Mamiya/Sekor C220). I have many, some are non-functional but I still keep them primarily for the sentimental aspects. I have many lenses and accessories since my photography has evolved over the years.

What are your favorite interests/subjects to photograph?

My photo interests have been diverse through the years. Now, I lean towards compositionally correct, minimal manipulation in my photography. My favorite style is like the work of Aaron Siskinds abstraction photography in the 50's and 60's.

Originally I was an art major in college, after I took a darkroom class at UMD, I was hooked on photography. I still immerse myself with the history of photography and looking at photographs. My library is overflowing with all kinds of photography books.

What do expect to get out of being a member of the Saint Paul Camera Club?

I am eager to be with other people who also enjoy photography! I hope that I can contribute and help the club with the knowledge I have learned over the years.

Why did you choose to join the Saint Paul Camera Club?

I am looking for a professional camera club that is well organized where I can learn at a more advanced level about photography. I have been to a few clubs around the community and seem to like what I see at the meetings for the St Paul Camera Club. What brand/model of camera(s) do you shoot with?

The Lake Superior Magazine Weekly Blog, "Around the Circle" carried this article which may be of interest to photographers of birds.

Where the birds are: Birders hardcore or casual can tap a newly updated online resource, the Minnesota Breeding Bird Atlas, a decades-long project with roots to the 1977 creation of the state's Nongame Wildlife Program. The atlas covers 249 bird species, all species breeding in the state, with field observations gathered from 2009 to 2013 by hundreds of volunteers and then compiled and recently available. A printed publication is also being pursued. The online atlas has interactive maps showing areas where birds have been documented, as well as information pages about each species and photos.

- 6. If there is some specific advice you are seeking, please make that clear in your email to the Panel member.

For example: how should this be cropped? Would this be better in black and white? What can be done to improve the color? Composition? etc.

December 5, 2017 Due November 21	"Open" Color	"Selfie" Digital Images	Representation of your personality. Creative and unusual picture of self. Let your imagination run wild. Does not need to be an image of your face, but some portion of your body that represents your personality. Must be taken of and by the member. The Club Christmas Party is on December 19
January 2, 2018 Due December 19	"Open" Monochrome	"Artifical Light" Digital Images	Primary light source is illumination by some source of artificial light. Examples, but not limited to: strobes, flashes, lamps, head lights, light fixtures.
February 6, 2018 Due January 16	"Open" Color	"Night Photography" Digital Images	Photographs taken out of doors between dusk and dawn, using artificial light or long exposures, or both, as in the case of light painting.
March 6, 2018 Due February 20	"Open" Monochrome	"Winter" Digital Images	Anything that depicts the season of winter.
April 3, 2018 Due March 20	"Open" Color	"Public Events/Festivals" Digital Images	Including, but not limited to, County and State Fairs, local celebrations, parades, political rallies, and carnivals. Must depict the essence of the event.
May 1, 2018 Due April 17	"Open" Monochrome	"Contemporary/Creative" Digital Images	Just about anything goes. Alter the image to produce a new abstract effect. The important thing is the result, not the means used to create it. There are literally no rules to follow. Generally, concentrate on form and color, rather than on detail.
June 5, 2018 Due May 1	N/A	Annual Banquet and Awards Night	All 8, 9 and 10-point Color and Monochrome Prints should be turned in by May 3rd for year- end award judging.
